Dear Eagle Scout & Unit Leader,

Attached you will find the 2017 Clarice Bagwell Eagle Scholarship Application. This year our Council will award 5-\$1000 scholarships to Eagle Scouts who will graduate from high school in spring 2017 and plan to further their education in the fall of 2017.

The scholarship will be dispensed in the form of a check made payable to the recipient. The funds are restricted to educational expenses only (for example, tuition, books, clothes, travel expenses, food).

To be eligible, the Eagle Scout must meet these requirements:

- He must be a high school senior this year (2016-2017)
- He must have already earned his Eagle rank in the Northeast Georgia Council (he may earn the rank at any time up to the graduating year).
- He must commit to attending college or another post-secondary school in the Fall of 2017.

The scholarships will be awarded at the Eagle Banquet, which is on April 29, 2017 at the Gainesville First Baptist Church. If you are awarded one of the scholarships, you will be notified in advance, so you may make plans to attend. Applications must be turned in to the Jefferson Service Center by March 3, 2017, to be considered.

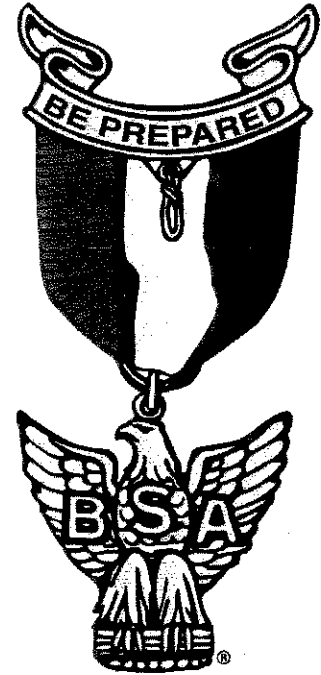

Eagle Scout Scholarship Guidelines

Since the scholarships will be presented in April 2017, at our Eagle Banquet, these guidelines have been set to accommodate the following timetables:

- Candidates must have earned the Eagle Scout Award in the Northeast Georgia Council.
- Candidates must be a high school senior the year that the scholarship is awarded.
- It does not matter which year the Eagle Scout Award is earned
- Candidates must commit to attending college/school the next fall or return the scholarship money to the Council.
- The scholarships will be restricted for college/school expenses of any kind:
 - Example: tuition, books, clothes, travel to school, food at school, other school expenses, but not social expenses.
- Scholarship applications must be submitted to the council office by the deadline to be considered.
- A committee of adult Eagle Scouts (with no personal ties to any current applicant) will decide the winners of the scholarships.
- Letters of recommendation are encouraged from Scout Leaders, religious leaders, and/or school leaders.



Scholarship Timetable

- Deadline for applicants to submit forms to the Jefferson Service Center, March 3, 2017.
- Scholarships will be presented to recipients during the Council's Eagle Banquet set for April 29, 2017.
